Follow the St. Peter's Allhallowtide treasure hunt to learn more about the ancient traditions that put the creepiness in Hallowe'en!

What is Allhallowtide?

Allhallowtide is a word that comes from the people who invented the name Hallowe'en! Hallowe'en is one of the three days of Allhallowtide.

Allhallowtide is a “triduum” (a day of three feasts) comprising All Hallows' Eve (Oct.31, Halloween), All Saints' Day (Nov. 1), and All Souls' Day (Nov. 2) in the Western Christian tradition. Allhallowtide comes at the transition between fall and winter, and it gives us a chance to reflect on all those who have gone before us.

For the first clue, look near the pot of marigolds on the exterior of the St. Peter's property.

All other clues and treasures will be either along Brewster Ave. or Clinton St.
